It was great to welcome some new and young faces, and to catch up with the regulars.




8h20 and we set off, the sun already blazing down upon us; sure to be a very hot day. It was an easy start, following the road for about 5kms passed numerous Zebra, a Wildebeest some Blesbuck, and two rather cute little Warthogs.

From the road we had a good view of the Howick Falls, flowing with gusto. We also passed some *Leonotis leonurus* (aka Wild Dagga) though no volunteers opting to try it!











At the start of the trail we stopped briefly for a sip of water before heading into the undergrowth. The path runs along the cliff bottom, the shrubbery keeping it shady but also a little stifling without the breeze. Leading the pack, I also had the unfortunate duty of clearing away the
